### **Community School of Music and Arts Presents Quinteto Latino, May 20**

MOUNTAIN VIEW, CA – The Community School of Music and Arts (CSMA) in Mountain View presents a free concert with Quinteto Latino on Sunday, May 20 at 2:00pm. The event will be held in Tateuchi Hall at the Community School of Music and Arts, located at 230 San Antonio Circle in Mountain View. Seating is limited, so please arrive early. Doors open at 1:30pm.

Quinteto Latino is a Bay Area wind quintet with a mission to build community through the performance and advocacy of Latino classical music. Founded in 2004 by French horn player Armando Castellano, this unique ensemble aims to expand the boundaries of classical music tradition, commonly perceived as predominantly Euro-American, by performing works exclusively by Latino composers. The group blends the vibrant colors and vigorous rhythms of Latin American music with the sumptuous voices of the wind quintet. Quinteto Latino features Kyle Bruckmann (oboe), Armando Castellano (French horn), Diane Grubbe (flute), Shawn Jones (bassoon) and Leslie Tagorda (clarinet). Whether exploring new twists on traditional folk songs or premiering works by living composers, these five musicians perform with impeccable artistry and infectious energy – educating, enriching, and entertaining listeners of all ages and backgrounds.

Quinteto Latino's debut CD, *Cien Años de Música Mexicana para Quinteto de Alientos / 100 Years of Mexican Music for Wind Quintet* was released in 2011. In October 2013, they hosted a Festival of Latin American Chamber Music, featuring concerts and community events in four Bay Area cities, and included over 100 students and 17 professional chamber musicians, composers and musicologists from all over the world. Recent major projects include collaborations with San Juan-based Chicano theatre company Teatro Campesino and a commission by Latina composer Gabriela Lena Frank.

This event is part of CSMA's 2017-2018 Community Concert Series. In keeping with CSMA's mission to provide *Arts for All*, Community Concerts are free and open to the public. The Community Concert Series is supported by a generous grant from the Applied Materials Foundation. The official media sponsor for the series is Classical KDFC radio.
