This unique chorus is a welcoming group composed of singers of all ages, backgrounds, interests and experience levels – from beginners to seasoned choral singers. The World Harmony Chorus performs enjoyable and interesting music from a variety of ethnicities, nationalities and folk traditions from around the globe.

Innovative musician Daniel Steinberg, the founder and director of the World Harmony Chorus, has been a member of the CSMA faculty since 1999. Making music accessible to everyone is Mr. Steinberg's personal commitment. He believes that "anyone can participate in music, regardless of age, experience, or natural ability." He sees music-making "as an essential element of community-building" and asserts that "an awareness of the traditional music of other cultures helps to bring about a better understanding of the world and ultimately, promotes world peace."
